A Great Place To Learn

- ★ Mrs. Holm organized a lunch meet-and-greet for new students in grades 1-3, with over 40 participants attending across four lunch periods. The event included a Q&A session and opportunities for the students to get to know one another. Many of these learners also attended our New Family Tour Night held on August 26th. - ★ We have a testing "Sweep Team" who are trained testers that will go to each building 3 times/school year to conduct the testing using our new screener, Acadiance. Using a team of testers is an efficient and consistent practice for screening, and it doesn't take away pertinent instruction time from classroom teachers and students.
- ★ A panel of 3rd-grade learners participated in an online conversation with author Lawrence Diggs.

A Great Place To Work:

★ This month, our reading teachers collaborated with Kim from Compass (MTSS) during both grade-level and building-level meetings. The focus was on understanding RTI (Response to Intervention) and aligning our Tier 1 literacy plan for grades K-5.

★ The SDSU Softball team participated in our High Five Fridays event, warmly greeting and welcoming our students as they arrived at school.
